Looking back on 2021, it was a year that seems to have treated each person and each farming operation differently. However, the sorghum industry has remained strong. We saw variability in weather, prices and production levels. For some, the weather allowed their sorghum crop to excel, and combined with high prices, sorghum generated impressive revenue for their farm. Others, like myself, did not have favorable weather but still produced a respectable sorghum crop at great prices.

These two scenarios, ideal conditions and stressful conditions. allow for sorghum's strengths to be showcased at both ends of the spectrum. I have often called sorghum my "risk minimizing" crop, because I know it will yield in good conditions and it will outyield my other options in stressful conditions. The broad spectrum in which sorghum fits has been a focus of the Sorghum Checkoff. As a checkoff, we are responsible for inviting producers to showcase their success with sorghum in various growing conditions. We have focused on projects that will move sorghum forward in both ideal and challenging conditions.

One of our largest accomplishments has been the release of herbicide tolerant sorghum that

allows sorghum producers to control grassy annual weeds. The Sorghum Checkoff has been instrumental from the beginning of this work and continues to evaluate the herbicide tolerant programs to not only improve the programs but also help educate the producers in implementing these programs into their operations. This technology is in producer's fields now and is available for widespread acres.

Sustainability has been a popular term for all sectors of the agriculture industry. The Sorghum Checkoff has dedicated intense focus and manpower to the remarkable sustainability story of sorghum. Many of the factors that minimize risk for sorghum farmers are also a huge part of sorghum's sustainability. This has produced an exciting partnership with Pheasants Forever/Quail Forever that will better document this sustainability.

There are exciting achievements in all other areas of the Sorghum Checkoff as well. The ethanol industry and renewable fuels continue to be exciting with continued work and investment. The human food focus has gained incredible traction in recent years and continues to expand with interest from chefs incorporating sorghum into their recipes. Our communications

department plays a vital role in the production of high-quality materials and media that increase our producer education and information. They are "world-class" as the communications department and they have received impressive awards over the last year.

The Sorghum Checkoff continues to invest in leadership training. In 2021, we embarked with another class of Leadership Sorghum; This area aims to continually improve on an already fantastic program. Former Leadership Sorghum class members currently make up over 45% of the Sorghum Checkoff board as well as other leadership positions locally and nationally.





SORGHUM CHECKOFF NAMED NATIONAL SPONSOR BY PHEASANTS FOREVER & QUAIL FOREVER

Building upon an existing conservation and working lands partnership, Pheasants Forever and Quail Forever (PF&QF) recently announced the Sorghum Checkoff (USCP) as the organization's newest national sponsor. Promoting farm-level sustainability and profitability for sorghum growers in the Great Plains, the organizations are committed to showcasing the nexus between upland bird habitats and sorghum production, consumer perceptions, nutrition and their producers' bottom lines.

BRITTANY SMITH HIRED AS PRECISION AG & CONSERVATION SPECIALIST UNDER USCP PARTNERSHIP WITH PF&QF

In an important step forward in advancing the Sorghum Checkoff's partnership with Pheasants Forever & Quail Forever (PF&QF) around farm-level conservation and profitability, PF&QF has hired Brittany Smith as the new Precision Ag & Conservation Specialist to help expand and enhance technical support offered to growers in a key sorghum-production area in western and west-central Kansas. Smith will work one-on-one with growers, to help them identify strategic opportunities for the implementation of conservation practices in a way that contributes to the farm's environmental sustainability, while also improving the operation's profitability and bottom line.

PF&QF AND USCP UNVEIL HABITAT INCENTIVE PROGRAM FOR KANSAS SORGHUM PRODUCERS

PF&QF have partnered with the USCP to offer conservation cost-share opportunities for sorghum producers in western Kansas. The new sustainability initiative – Sorghum for B.I.R.D.S. (Building Innovative, Resilient, and Diverse agricultural Systems) – targets low performing acres by offering growers a one-time incentive payment to apply targeted conservation practices in tandem with sorghum production. The Sorghum for B.I.R.D.S. application period is now open to Kansas producers in a 15-county region.

RESEARCH AND EDUCATION TO FURTHER ENHANCE OPPORTUNITIES FOR SORGHUM

The Sorghum Checkoff released two requests for proposals for research and education in 2021. The first is a targeted request for full proposals in strategic areas of pet food utilization and development, sorghum physiology and sorghum protein evaluation and development. The second is a general request for pre-proposals in keeping with the organization's mission of revealing the potential and versatility of sorghum through increased shared value.

WAXY SORGHUM

The Sorghum Checkoff is currently working with seed companies and public seed developers to evaluate new, competitive waxy grain sorghum hybrids while simultaneously increasing testing of this product with end users. As always, the ultimate goal is to increase grain sorghum value for both the producer and consumer.

POULTRY FEED INGREDIENT UTILIZATION

United Sorghum Checkoff Program board of directors initiated a project in 2018 targeting sorghum as a feed for broilers and gamebirds in the southeast. The project was initially delayed as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, but the project is now coming to a close and the Sorghum Checkoff looks forward to reviewing the final project report. According to Clemson University, preliminary data suggests modern grain sorghum types showed potential for replacing corn at complete substitution in broiler diet formulation without negatively affecting performance. New feed trial data will be used by staff to extract and develop marketing products for distribution to targeted end-users from the global poultry and feedstuffs industry.

SORGHUM CHECKOFF PROGRAM GRANTS INTERNATIONAL FARM YOUTH EXCHANGE \$13,060

Recognizing the value an international experience can have on young leaders, the United Sorghum Checkoff Program approved a grant to the IFYE Association of the USA, Inc. for \$13,060. The funding will be targeted to support a participant in the IFYE international commodity leadership program for the sorghum industry.

NEW PROMOTION AND RESEARCH PROGRAMS FUNDED

The United Sorghum Checkoff Program is generating new interest in sorghum research by awarding \$5 million in sorghum research projects. In 2021, the Sorghum Checkoff funded 17 of the 21 proposals submitted.

EXPORT SORGHUM BOXES REACH BUYERS

Facing the struggles of COVID-19, The United Sorghum Checkoff Program was unable to personally meet with buyers around the world. At the end of October, USCP sent out boxes with 4 samples of sorghum from 4 different growers across Texas, Kansas and Nebraska. These boxes also included fact cards with QR codes that linked to videos of the farmer themselves speaking about their sorghum crop, yields, inputs, harvest and more





POULTRY TRIALS IN KENYA

The U.S. Grains Council (USGC) recently traveled to Kenya to oversee a project that includes feeding poultry a diet that includes sorghum. This project is intended to introduce the benefits of sorghum and how it can be useful in animal feed rations.

SORGHUM CHECKOFF PARTICIPATES IN UNITED TASTE EVENT

Sorghum Checkoff participated with the U.S. Grains Council in an event called "United Tastes", a U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) project led by its Foreign Agricultural Service (FAS), held in Ho Chi Minh City. The event promotes U.S. agricultural and food products with the food industry in Vietnam, and is the first event in the country promoting the use of food sorghum.

RECORD EXPORTS CONTINUE TO CHINA

China continues to shatter previously set export records. With China back in a big way, sorghum growers are seeing price rallies, improved basis and increased export demand. With China's commitments in the 2022 first quarter, U.S. producers are excited to meet international demand.

SORGHUM HARVEST QUALITY REPORT

The U.S. Grains Council (USGC) published its 2019/2020 Sorghum Quality Report touting an average grade well above the necessary requirements for U.S. No. 1 sorghum.

Total sorghum damage came in at just 0.2 percent and broken kernel and foreign material (BNFM) was only 1.7 percent, highlighting how hard the grain is and how well it holds up during handling and storage.
